# NEW YORK STATE ◀▶ QUÉBEC

In 2011, the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec (Conseil) concluded a reciprocity agreement with the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA). This agreement calls for the creation of an annual exchange program of professional artists and writers under which the applicants selected engage in creative residencies and periods of artistic renewal in Québec and New York State.

The artists participating in this program enjoy complete autonomy and define the objectives of their stay and elaborate the parameters and conditions for its realization. The applicants must submit a letter of intent from the host organization that undertakes to offer them professional guidance during their period of residence and that specifies the nature of the collaboration that the two partners intend to establish in conjunction with the project.
