In 2006, the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec (Conseil) has concluded a reciprocity agreement with the New Brunswick Arts Board. It establishes an annual exchange program that provides professional artists and writers with opportunities for creation and professional development residencies in New Brunswick.

Artists and writers enjoy complete autonomy and define the objectives of their period of residence and elaborate the parameters and conditions governing its realization in collaboration with an arts or community organization in the territory where the residence is to take place. Applicants must submit a letter of intent from the host organization that undertakes to offer them professional support during their residency and that specifies the nature of the collaboration that they intend to establish in conjunction with the project.
