



Artist and studio-apartment residency at TOKAS

JAPAN ◀▶ QUÉBEC

In 2015, the Conseil entered into a collaboration agreement with the Tokyo Arts and Space (TOKAS) in Japan, thereby expanding the network of residencies offered abroad to Québec artists and writers.

The residency at the TOKAS Arts will enable Québec artists and writers to engage in a significant experience contributing to their professional development. The new living environment and interaction with other artists will create conditions favourable to the fostering of creativity and the evolution of artistic approaches, indeed to the enhancement of the artists' international career profiles.

The Québec artist will have access to a workshop/residence situated in the Sumida Ward and will benefit from a potentially wide range of professional contacts. A Japanese artist (visual or digital arts) will be awarded a three-month residency at the Centre Clark in Montréal.
