Through this artist-in-residence program at one of the world's most prestigious arts centres, the Conseil wishes to foster the career development of Québec artists and enable them to benefit from the Banff Centre's extensive facilities.

This program enable five artists or writers to concentrate on their artistic work. The Centre fosters experimentation and the emergence of new perspectives. It encourages collaboration between guest artists and facilitates interdisciplinary approaches. Residents have the use of the studios, in addition to a private room.
